

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Looking back on 2024, I want to take a moment to reflect on the progress and achievements we made together in advancing economic development in our region. This year had some real challenges and uncertainty, but we remained resilient and innovative.

Throughout the year, LCDC worked tirelessly to attract and retain businesses for Leavenworth County. Hill's Pet Nutrition has a full year of production under their belt. DSM-Firmenich has almost finished construction and expects to be in production by March. Project Transport came to fruition, and Croucher and Associates purchased two lots in the Urban Hess Business Center where they will invest \$2.5 million to build a 25,000 square foot storage and distribution facility for Wind Electrical Construction Supply (WECS). They will supply large cable reels to national companies.

Most of our manufacturing companies have invested heavily in more technologically advanced equipment over the past year, allowing them to increase efficiency and productivity and reduce waste. Zephyr Products, for example, is in the final phase of their expansion, which includes a new seven-stage wash line for powder coating. The new powder coating facility has doubled their footprint and elevated them to the leading manufacturing employer in Leavenworth County.

LCDC has continued its work marketing the county to attract new business by responding to Requests for Information (RFI's), attending marketing events regionally and nationally, and conducting county tours and email and social media campaigns. LCDC received 59 project leads and responded to 33. 16 are still active.

LCDC works with businesses long after they locate in Leavenworth County, through the Business Retention and Expansion program. LCDC helped existing businesses overcome barriers to growth by assisting with state programs and workforce development. LCDC conducted 40 business visits in 2024 and helped several companies with state certification programs, grants, and loans.

To help businesses attract workforce, LCDC hosted two career fairs and championed the Career and Technical Education (CTE) Symposium to establish a county-wide CTE program. The program is a collaborative effort between our county's high schools and KCKCC to establish multiple CTE pathways for students, which will eliminate redundancies, maximize funding and available space, and expose our students to a wide range of career paths. The success of this program will ensure a skilled talent pipeline for businesses in Leavenworth County for years to come.

LCDC could not be successful without the support of our public and private investors, volunteers, and economic development partners. Thank you to everyone who has helped LCDC work toward and achieve their mission of facilitating the creation and retention of jobs and capital investment in Leavenworth County.
